- Advanced sensors, improved pressure control systems, and precise temperature control on the tray.
- A highly interactive user interface with familiar one-button operation.
- Seamless firmware upgrades, secure network connectivity, and easy syncing to the 10x Genomics Cloud.
- Similar performance as assessed by multiplet rates, library complexity, read mapping rates, and cell clustering.
- Compatible with both GEM-X and Next GEM single cell assays, including:
 - GEM-X: 500–20,000 cells per channel
 - Next GEM Standard assay: 500-10,000 cells per channel 500-30,000 cells per channel with CellPlex
 - Next GEM HT:
 2,000–20,000 cells per channel
 2,000–60,000 cells per channel with CellPlex

Step 1: Installation

Verify Bench Space

Follow these instructions for installation to operate the Chromium X/ iX properly and obtain maximum performance of the system. Before unboxing the instrument choose a location that:

- Is not situated in direct sunlight. Direct sunlight leads to inadequate cooling conditions or rapid evaporation of reagents.
- Includes a level, sturdy laboratory bench that is not subject to movement or vibration.
- Provides maximum bench space (front to back). Avoid areas that have obstruction in the rear such as power strips or house lines (spigots for vacuum or air).
- Allows access to the plug at the wall receptacle (to safely disconnect power).
- Allows access to the detachable power cord at the rear of the instrument.
- Provides a minimum of 4" (10 cm) clearance around unit to allow free air circulation.
- Provides a minimum of 6" (15 cm) directly in front of the instrument for unobstructed movement of the tray door.



Warning: The tray door is capable of moving an object that is in its opening path. If the object is near the edge of the workspace, it could fall and create a hazard.

General Power Safety

Grounding is required to prevent electric shock. If the power source is not grounded, qualified personnel must first install a reliable safety ground.


- DO NOT plug the instrument power cable into an electrical outlet if the power cable is damaged.
- To prevent electric shock, plug the instrument power cable into properly grounded outlets.
- When using an extension cable or power strip, ensure that the total ampere rating of the instrument does not exceed the ampere rating of the extension cable. The extension cable must be designed for grounded plugs and plugged into a grounded wall outlet.
- Be sure to grasp the plug, not the cable, when disconnecting the instrument from an electric socket.

- a. Open box according to box label "this side up." Carefully cut or remove the tape on the top of the box and open the top flaps. Ensure that cut is not too deep as it may damage the contents.
- **b.** Remove the Upgrade Kit box (present only if Chromium X upgrade was purchased) and packaging material. Carefully lift inner box out and open inner box according to box label "this side up."
- **c.** Remove the Chromium X/iX Accessory Kit box and packaging material.
- **d.** Carefully lift the tote bag holding the Chromium X/iX instrument out of the box and place on bench top. Remove the instrument from the tote bag. Remove all outer transportation packaging materials and tape.


Remove Shipping Material from Tray

The instrument may now include a shipping lock that further secures and stabilizes internal components to prevent damage during shipping. See the Accessory Kits table for more information.

The instrument ships with a shipping lock and shipping/readiness test block in position on the tray. This hardware secures and stabilizes internal components to prevent damage during shipping.

Follow these steps to remove the shipping lock.

- a. Remove the shipping lock: grab the red sticker covering the tray door by the "pull" tab and pull down carefully. This will manually open the tray door. Unscrew (by hand) the red metal shipping lock. Retain shipping lock in a marked bag or container in a convenient location in case the instrument requires future transportation.
- **b.** Close the tray door.



- **c.** Within the Accessory Kit box, locate the universal power cord and plug adaptors. Attach the correct country adaptor to the universal adaptor.
- **d.** Plug the Chromium X/iX into a properly grounded outlet of proper voltage.



DO NOT power on yet.



Ensure power source is reliably grounded before plugging the instrument's power cord into the power source (receptacle).

e. If using an Ethernet cable (not provided) to connect to the network, connect cable directly to the instrument.


Step 2: **First-Time Use**

The instrument will walk through a first-time setup protocol. Setup requires the following:


- 10x Genomics Account Onscreen instruction will guide account setup. Alternatively, visit cloud.10xgenomics. com/instruments to create an account beforehand.
- Instrument serial number and instrument ID Located onscreen during setup, and also on the label at the back of the instrument
- A computer with Internet access
- Network connection between instrument and 10x Cloud An internet connection is used for firmware updates. Wi-Fi configuration may not be available in your region. Ethernet is recommended for optimal performance. See the 10x Genomics Cloud section in Tips & Best Practices for more information.

Turn on the System

- **a.** Power on the instrument using the power switch at the back of the unit. If using Ethernet, connect the cable to the instrument Ethernet port.
- **b.** Follow onscreen instruction for Network Setup (via ethernet or Wi-Fi).




c. Set the Date and Time.

d. Register the instrument.


Navigate to register.10xgenomics.com using the onscreen QR code on a computer or phone with internet access. Create or log in to a 10x Genomics account. Enter the serial number + instrument ID found on the instrument screen. Read and accept the legal agreement.



e. Update the firmware.


Download the latest firmware update from your 10x Genomics account to the USB provided in the Instrument Accessory Kit. Insert USB into the back of the instrument.

After the instrument updates, a recommended configuration screen will appear. On this screen, the ability of the instrument to automatically upload diagnostic data as well as automatically download updates can be adjusted. 10x Genomics recommends keeping these settings on. These settings can be changed later.



Step 2: **First-Time Use** contd.

If either setting is turned off, the following warnings will appear:

Step 3: **Readiness Test**

The Readiness Test verifies that all systems are working optimally. The first-time setup protocol will prompt the initial readiness test:




DO NOT start the Readiness Test until all shipping materials, including the shipping lock, block, and tape, have been removed. Starting the Readiness Test with shipping materials present will cause the hardware to audibly grind until the instrument is powered down.

a. Follow screen instruction to launch the Readiness Test.




b. Once the tray is fully extended into the loading position, power off the instrument by flipping the switch at the back of the instrument. This step prevents the tray from auto-retracting during the procedure.



Step 3: **Readiness Test** contd.

c. Remove the blank, blue gasket from the shipping/readiness test block.



- d. Hold the block from one side and gradually apply force to lift the block from the tray.
- **e.** Peel off the yellow tapes from the block and discard.
- **f.** Reinstall blank gasket over the block to prepare for the Readiness Test.



- Ensure that the gasket is properly attached (See 10x Gasket Attachment section).
- Replace the assembled block on the tray.



Proceed to Readiness Test

- a. Turn on the instrument. Retract the tray. Press play to start the Readiness Test.
- **b.** After the test is complete, follow the onscreen instruction to remove the block with blank gasket from the tray.
- **c.** Store the assembled block and blank gasket in a plastic bag, away from sun-light and extreme temperature. Retain for future use.
- **d.** A successful Readiness Test marks the end of setup. The instrument is now ready for use.

Initiate subsequent Readiness Tests through the home screen by loading the shipping/readiness test block with blank gasket into the instrument. For optimal performance, tests are recommended at the following times:

- During first-time use (the shipping/readiness test block will already be present in the instrument)
- After any firmware update
- · After moving the instrument

Step 4: Main One-Touch **Operation**

The home screen indicates the instrument is ready for use. There are several key functions that provide valuable information.



Main Operation

a. Press eject button on the touchscreen to eject the tray. A chime will sound.




- **b.** Load an assembled chip and holder (See Tips & Best Practices as well as the appropriate assay kit user guide).
- **c.** Press the eject button again to close the tray.
 - If the eject button is not touched within 1 min, it will automatically close on its own.
 - System requires a few seconds before the tray can be reopened again.



Pinch risk: Ensure no obstructions or fingers present near closing tray.


The home screen will now display a play symbol and the name of the chip type. (Use Eject button in lower left corner of the screen to abort).

- **d.** Press the play button to start the run.
 - A midrun progress bar will show the time remaining in the run.



Step 4: **Main One-Touch Operation** contd.

e. At the end of a run, the button will display an eject symbol and a "Run Info" tab at the bottom of the screen. Green indicates a successful completed run.

Chip Handling

For instuctions on the standard assay Next GEM chip, consult the appropriate assay kit user guide.

General Chip Handling

- Minimize exposure of reagents, chips, and gaskets to sources of particles and fibers, laboratory wipes, frequently opened flip-cap tubes, clothing that sheds fibers, and dusty surfaces.
- After removing the chip from the sealed bag, use in ≤ 24 h.
- Execute steps without pause or delay, unless indicated. When using multiple chips, load, run, and collect the content from one chip before loading the next.
- Avoid contacting the bottom surface of the chip with gloved hands and other surfaces. Frictional charging can lead to inadequate priming of the channels, potentially leading to either clogs or wetting failures.
- Minimize the distance that a loaded chip is moved to reach the Chromium instrument.
- Keep the chip horizontal to prevent wetting the gasket with oil, which depletes the input volume and may adversely affect the quality of the resulting emulsion.



Chromium Next GEM Chip (HT) Handling

- Only even number of reactions can be run on the chip. Consult the "Load Chromium Next GEM Chip" section of the appropriate assay kit user guide for specific instructions.
- Fill all unused paired input wells on a chip with an appropriate volume of 50% glycerol solution before loading the used wells.



GEM-X Chip Handling

• Fill all unused input wells in rows labeled 1, 2, and 3 on a chip with an appropriate volume of 50% glycerol solution before loading the used wells. DO NOT add glycerol to the wells in the top NO FILL row.

Chip Handling contd.

Chromium X/iX Chip Holders

- Chromium X/iX Chip Holders encase both Chromium Next GEM Chips used for HT (high throughput assay) and Chromium GEM-X Chips.
- The holder lid flips over to become a stand, holding the chip at 45 degrees for optimal recovery well content removal.
- Squeeze the sliders on the back side of the holder together to unlock the lid and return the holder to a flat position.



Chip & Holder Assembly




- Close the holder lid. Attach the gasket by holding the tongue (curved end, to the right) and hook the gasket on the left-hand tabs of the holder. Gently pull the gasket toward the right and hook it on the two right-hand tabs.
- DO NOT touch the smooth side of the gasket.
- Open the chip holder.
- · Align notch on the chip (upper left corner) and the open holder with the gasket attached.
- Slide chip to the left until the guide on the holder is inserted into the chip.
- Depress the right hand side of the chip until the spring-loaded clip engages.
- Keep the assembled unit with the attached gasket until ready for dispensing reagents into the wells.

Chip Handling contd.

Chip Loading


- Place the assembled chip and holder flat (gasket attached) on the bench with the lid open.
- Dispense at the bottom of the wells without introducing bubbles.
- When dispensing Gel Beads into the chip, wait for the remainder to drain into the bottom of the pipette tips and dispense again to ensure complete transfer.
- Consult the "Load Chromium Next GEM Chip" or "Load GEM-X Chip" section of the appropriate assay kit user guide for specific instructions.



10x Gasket Attachment


- **Before reagents are loaded,** attach the gasket by holding the tongue (curved end, to the right) and hook the gasket on the left-hand tabs of the holder. Gently pull the gasket toward the right and hook it on the two right-hand tabs.
- DO NOT touch the smooth side of the gasket.
- Keep the assembled unit with the gasket attached until ready for dispensing reagents into the wells.
- After loading reagents, DO NOT press down on the top of the gasket. Keep the assembly horizontal to avoid wetting the gasket with Partitioning Oil.

Blank gaskets meant for the shipping/readiness test block are not compatible with the Chromium X/iX Chip Holder.



Chip Placement on Chromium X Tray

Indentations and locater pins assist in proper placement of the assembled chip and holder on the instrument tray.



10x Genomics Cloud

10x Genomics Cloud (accessible through cloud.10xgenomics.com/ instruments), allows creation of a universal user account for all of the web services offered by 10x Genomics. Using the instrument management tool, users can access the instrument information and download the latest firmware updates for their instruments.

Each Chromium X Series instrument is required to be registered to the 10x Genomics Cloud during the First Time Use (FTU) set up process. Users may register multiple instruments to their accounts, and each instrument can optionally be registered to multiple 10x Genomics accounts. Instruments connected to the network can also transfer serviceability data directly to 10x Genomics, enabling streamlined customer service.





Menu Options

The menu options page can be used to access run logs, configure network connectivity, and access system settings.




Power off the instrument by first performing a soft power down, by holding the power icon at the bottom of the menu options screen. In the soft power down mode, the screen will dim and display the time and the name of the instrument. To complete the shut down process, flip the power switch at the back.

Performing a soft power down prior to completely powering down the instrument enables the instrument to save logs.

Logs

Access and upload past run information. File capacity is 650 runs. Oldest files are deleted first. Log export ranges in size from 10s to 100s of MB, depending on how many runs are selected.



Idle time data are only instrument-specific logs that are not related to runs. The data can be exported during First-Time Use (FTU) setup by using the help icon on the top right corner of the screen. If the instrument is not performing a run, It can also be exported by navigating to Menu > System > Help and pressing "Send System Logs to Technical Support".

Menu Options contd.

To review run logs with 10x Genomics Technical Support:

- Email <u>Support@10xgenomics.com</u> with any applicable error codes.
- Upload pertinent logs directly to 10x Cloud or via USB. Support personnel will guide the user through these steps.

Export Procedure for Support Packages

Support packages can be exported from the Run Data page by pressing the Support button.

- a. Select a location to export support packages. Support packages can be exported directly to 10x Genomics on instruments connected to the internet (recommended), or to a USB drive.
- **b.** Select runs for export, then click "Start Export". A progress bar will show the export status.
- **c.** Once export is complete, the user will be redirected back to the Run Data log screen.

Deleting Run Data

The instrument stores up to 100 Run Data and up to 10 Support Data. The instrument does not automatically delete Run Data without user permission, while older Support Data is deleted automatically (oldest files are deleted first).

When data storage is full, a popup error message will inform the user to export and delete stored data before starting a new run.

- **a.** Export all important run data before permanently deleting.
- **b.** Navigate to Menu > Run Data.
- **c.** Click the trash can icon. Select individual runs or click Select All.
- **d.** Confirm Delete Data in the popup. A loading screen may appear while the instrument is deleting data.
- e. The screen will redirect back to Run Data. Deleted runs should no longer appear in the list.

Menu Options contd.

Connectivity

Configure parameters for Wi-Fi and Ethernet from this menu option. Ethernet is recommended for optimal performance.

The following connectivity icons may be found in the upper right corner of the screen:



Click Diagnostics to enhance instrument stability and reliability. This enables the automatic transmission of diagnostic data, such as sensor readings, metrics, and user-editable fields to 10x Cloud when connected to the internet. To maximize internet stability and enable the 10x Genomics support team to quickly respond to issues, Diagnostics is enabled after software updates.

Network & Security

Allow outbound TCP port 443 for 10x Genomics Cloud access. As an additional (optional) level of security, the instrument can be put on its own network VLAN with Internet-only access.

For connectivity to work correctly, the network should allow unrestricted outbound access to the following hosts:

- pool.ntp.org:123
- 10x-cloud-saas-instrument-assets.s3.us-west-2.amazonaws.com:443

Menu Options contd.

System

The system runs on a Linux platform. The instrument's hardware and software have been securely implemented to prevent modification and to only execute trusted 10x code. There is no end-user configuration or access to the internal hardware, OS, or applications. The system menu can be used to:

- **Locate information** about this instrument such as serial number, instrument ID, and firmware version.
- Change the date and time by country or time zone. Time can be set automatically via network connection. Toggle between 12-hour or 24hour time.
- · Launch an alternate mode
 - **Shipping Mode** is used for safe instrument transportation. The shipping/readiness test block and a gasket are required for transporting the Chromium X in shipping mode. See the Maintenance section Moving & Shipping the Instrument, for specific instructions for shipping mode.
 - Fluidics Flush Mode is used for clearing liquid from the gasket only in specific troubleshooting instances. Use only if directed by 10x Genomics Support.
- Export idle instrument logs to 10x Genomics by navigating to Alternative Modes > Help.
- Enable automatic firmware downloads

Firmware update notifications will appear on the home screen when the instrument is connected to a network.

Firmware Update Procedure

Step 1: Download and install the update

Procedure with an instrument connected to the internet and auto-download enabled (recommended):

Automatic downloads of updates are enabled after firmware updates to ensure the instrument is up-to-date with the latest assay products, features, and bug fixes.

- **a.** A pop-up on the home screen will alert the user of available updates.
- **b.** Open the pop-up and click to install.

Procedure with an instrument connected to the internet, auto-download disabled:

- **a.** A pop-up on the home screen will alert the user of available updates.
- **b.** Open pop-up and click to download.
- **c.** Once the update has been downloaded, install the update.

Step 2: Reinitialize the instrument

After installing an update, run a Readiness Test. See Readiness Test section for further quidance.

a. Retrieve the shipping/readiness test block with attached blank gasket.

See the Readiness Test section for more information on the block.

- **b.** Initiate a Readiness Test through the home screen by loading the block into the instrument.
- **c.** After the test is complete, follow screen instruction to remove the block from the tray.
- **d.** Store the assembled block and gasket in a plastic bag, away from sunlight and extreme temperature. Retain for future use.
- **e.** The instrument is now ready for use.

System Maintenance

Interior

The Chromium X Series tray and door areas have been designed to catch and contain drips and a small volume of liquid spills. Occasionally, use a soft lab towel to clean these areas with a mixture of mild detergent and distilled water. For deeper, more thorough cleaning, it is acceptable to use a 5-10% Bleach solution followed by a 70% ethanol wash.



Do not use acetone or other harsh solvents, as these may remove the colored markings in the tray. Apply all standard safety practices when using cleaners, and dispose of any generated waste in a responsible manner.

Exterior

The exterior of the Chromium X Series instrument should always be kept clean and free of dust and debris that may affect its function and/ or cooling efficiency. Generally, the exterior finish can be wiped down using a mixture of mild detergent and distilled water applied to a slightly dampened lab towel. As an added precaution it is recommended that the instrument be unplugged from the power source before beginning any cleaning process.

Service



Electrical shock hazard. Do not open the Chromium X/iX. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Refer all servicing to qualified 10x Genomics service personnel.

Servicing is required when the Chromium X/iXhas been damaged in any way (e.g., a power entry module or plug is damaged, liquid was spilled into, or objects fell into the instrument, the instrument does not operate properly, or has been dropped).

Use only the power cord supplied with the Chromium X/iX. Do not replace it with a non-approved power cord as it may be inadequately rated to handle the electrical loads.

If replacing the externally accessible fuses in the power entry module becomes necessary, use only certified (EN60127 Sheet 5) 5 x 20 mm sized fuses rated T3.15AH, 250V Slow-Blow or equivalent.

When returning a Chromium X/iX for repair, take steps to ensure that the instrument has been decontaminated so as not to pose a hazard for 10x Genomics service personnel.

Environmental Requirements

It is the design intent of the Chromium X/iX that it be used in a typical indoor laboratory environment. The instrument's operating temperature is 18–28°C (64–82°F), Humidity 80% Max (Non-Condensing) Altitude 0-7500 ft (0-2286 m) (See Product Specifications).

Moving & Shipping the Instrument

The Chromium X/iX utilizes a shipping mode for safe instrument transportation. Shipping mode can be launched through the Alternate Modes menu option. The shipping/readiness test block and a blank gasket are required for transporting the Chromium X/iX in shipping mode, even for short distances (e.g., from one bench to another). If the Chromium X/ iX will be transported in a vehicle or shipped, it should also be repackaged according to the instructions below. The Readiness Test should be re-run (See Readiness Test section) after relocating the instrument.

Step 1: Shipping Mode (for all transportation)

- **a.** Retrieve the shipping/readiness test block and blank gasket from storage.
- **b.** Launch Shipping Mode (for safe instrument transportation). Menu Options > System > Alternate Modes > Shipping Mode
- **c.** Follow the screen prompts for loading the shipping/readiness test block with blank gasket, which will instruct a soft power down.
- **d.** Turn off the instrument completely using the power switch on the back of the instrument.
- e. Remove the power cord.




DO NOT turn on the Chromium X/iX again after inserting the shipping/ readiness test block. It will raise the manifold into a position unsafe for shipping.

Step 2: Shipping Lock (for shipping)


The instrument may now include a shipping lock that further secures and stabilizes internal components to prevent damage during shipping. See the Accessory Kits table for more information and email support@10xgenomics.com to request a shipping lock for pre-existing instruments.

- **a.** Fold over the end of a length of lab tape and place top-to-bottom along the right side of the tray door, to imitate the First-Time Use sticker tab.
- **b.** Pull down on the folded end of the tape carefully. This will manually open the tray door. Screw in (by hand) the red metal shipping lock.
- **c.** Close the tray door.

Error Screens

The touchscreen will guide the user through recoverable errors. If the error continues, or if the instrument has seen critical or intermediate errors, email Support@10xgenomics.com with the error code displayed.

Support will request log files for troubleshooting. Upload pertinent logs to 10x Genomics by navigating to the Logs menu option on screen. (See Logs section).

There are two types of errors:



User Recoverable Errors – (yellow circle on screen) Follow error handling instructions through the touchscreen and continue the run.

- Gasket Error
- Trav Error
- Chip Loading Error / Chip Locating Error / Missing Chip Error
- Unsupported Chip Error
- Network Error
- Update Error

Critical Errors – (red circle on screen) When the instrument has seen a critical error, the run will immediately abort. Do not proceed with any further runs. Contact support@10xgenomics.com with the error code.

- Temperature Error
- Firmware Error

Fluidics Flush Mode

This alternate mode is used for clearing liquid from the gasket. Only use if directed by 10x Genomics Support.

Pressure Release Valve

This factory button aids qualified 10x Genomics service personnel in manually ejecting the instrument tray in the event that the instrument is unresponsive.
